## Vesuvius Pompeii Facts

- Mount Vesuvius erupted many times. The famous one was in 79 AD, which is the one that created Pompeii's main tourist attraction and history. Some of the eruptions that occurred since 79 AD are in 172, 203, 222, 303, 379, 472, 512, 536, 685, 787 and a lot more. The most recent was in 1944, which was the 2<sup>nd</sup> biggest after 79 ad.
- Lots of Volcanoes explode with such force that they shoot rocks and lava high, up in the air. They are pushed out of the crater at the top of the cone. Rivers of burning lava pour out of the volcano and rush down the sides. The lava is sticky and hardens very quickly.
- There are some volcanoes that still erupt today. On the island of Stromboli near Italy, small explosions occur every few minutes. The people in the local villages have nothing to fear because the eruptions are too small to cause any harm or be dangerous. For 2,500 years the volcano has been used like a lighthouse for sailors. For at day you can find it smoking and by night it glows red.
- Normally there are signs before an eruption. For weeks before the volcano explodes, there are ground tremors. Steam and sparks shoot out of the top of the Volcano. People may also notice that animals such as rats, mice, dogs and snakes start to behave strangely.
- Scientists study volcanoes so they can warn people when an eruption is about to occur.

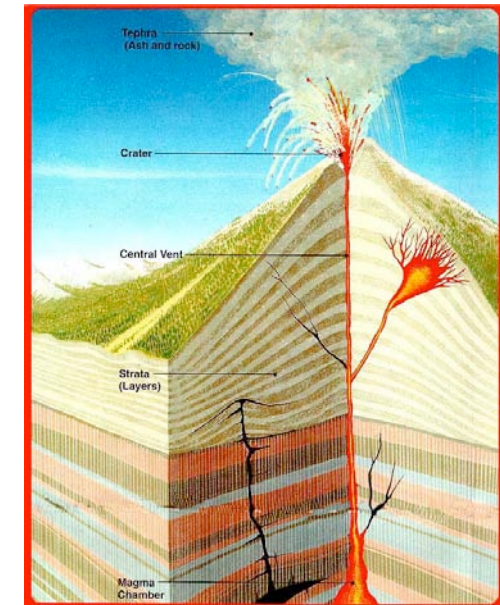
